- 1. Where is Elon Musk from?

  He is from South Africa. (0.05)

  Car batteries caught on fire, recalls and production delays. (2.33)

- 12. What happened to this company?

  After investors raised doubts about its business model, Solracity shares quickly lost value and TESLA had to take it over. (2.56)
- 13. Which are the companies that Elon Musk has been involved with? *PayPal, Spacex, TESLA and Solarcity.*
